

JAN HOWLIN

'Clay is my building material and my paint. I love it for its sculptural potential and its capacity to embody the ideas I like to invest in the making. It's a very physical experience working with clay, and often an exploratory one, because as the issues that motivate the pieces change, so do the techniques and processes involved.'

'I hope that the works I make - despite their generally domestic scale - possess stature, meaning, personality and sometimes humour. I hope that through some quiet power they can stand up and be seen, tell their stories, and make very human connections with people.'

Sydney-based artist Jan Howlin makes sculptural ceramics that present ideas and meaning through form. Her subject matter ranges from the everyday and personal, to the environmental and political.

Trained at Sydney College of the Arts, she completed a Bachelor of Visual Arts, Honours I, in 2006, and a Master of Fine Arts in 2010. She has since maintained a full-time creative practice working from One+2 Artist Studios in Balmain and exhibited regularly.
